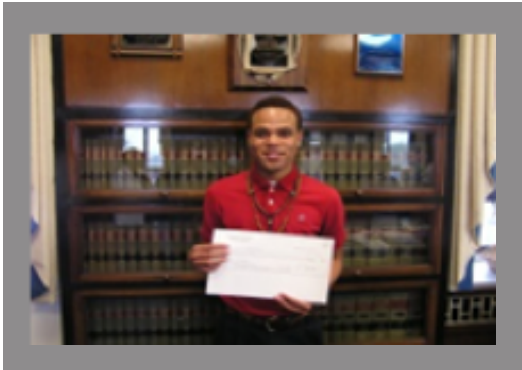

MISSION STATEMENT

Sigma Pi Phi is the oldest African-American Fraternity. The Chattanooga chapter of the Fraternity, Gamma Pi Boulé, for the past several years has sought to positively affect the lives of promising young African American males by recognizing and encouraging high academic achievement and leadership potential. It therefore initiated a program to provide financial support and incentives to well qualified college bound graduating high school males and to provide them with productive adult African-American males as mentors as they work their way through college and enter the work force. The theme of this program is "Positively Affecting Lives."

THE PROGRAM

The program is named the Gamma Pi Paul A. McDaniel Boulé Scholarship Program. It is named in honor of Gamma Pi member Paul A. McDaniel, former pastor of Second Missionary Baptist Church and former Hamilton County Commissioner. Rev. McDaniel is a legendary civic and community leader. Rev. McDaniel is one of the founders of Gamma Pi. He embodies all the qualities Gamma Pi hopes to encourage and instill in these young scholars. Since its inception, approximately \$66,000 has been awarded.

THE APPLICATION PROCESS

High achieving students are selected for the scholarships through a competitive process that requires them to complete an application, write an essay, and provide letters of recommendation. Grade point average and standardized test scores are considered in the process but are not determinative. From the initial pool of applicants a smaller number will be invited in for personal interviews by members of Gamma Pi's Scholarship Committee. The committee uses a "whole person" concept and looks for leadership potential, academic potential, life experiences, hardships faced or overcome, and community involvement. The very top candidates are then recommended for a scholarship that will vary from \$1,000 up to a four-year scholarship of \$3,000 per year. As many as five scholarships have been given in prior years. Gamma Pi works with area high school guidance counselors and principals in an effort to give as many students as possible an opportunity to apply for the scholarships.

APPLICATION DEADLINE

Applications are due on March 1st each year. An application for the scholarship can be obtained from high school guidance counselors or any member of Gamma Pi Boulé.
